God bless you all!!!



From I-90... Exit to By-pass 20 to Freeport. Take next exit to 20 to Belvidere. First stoplight on 20 turn RIGHT on Mill road. At stopsign, turn Left on W.State Street. Drive over bridge and turn Right where green sign says Cherry Valley Road (walnut). Go one block and turn LEFT onto Cherry Valley Road (says also Genoa Road). Drive many miles and turn RIGHT onto Annie Glidden Road. Drive many miles to N.I.U. campus and Turn LEFT on Hillcrest. Turn Right at stopsign on Normal Road. Christ the Teacher parish./Newman Center Church is on your left about 3 blocks down: park in church parking lot (not in University Parking lot)

Summer Camp For Deaf Catholics

Camp Mark Seven is offering a Summer Bible Institute week, Sunday, June 22nd through Saturday, June 28th, 2008, in Old Forge, New York. Located on the Fourth Lake in the Adirondack Mountains it was established in 1981 by Fr. Thomas Coughlin and members of the Deaf Catholic Community. Cost is \$375 and includes room and board, conferences, recreation and an ICDA Scholarship of \$100 for any applicant. Travel costs to and from New York are not included. Starts with breakfast, morning Mass and prayer, morning conference on the Scriptures, lunch, recreation (swimming, hiking, reading, boating), afternoon reflection, evening prayers, dinner and a bonfire conference in the evening.
