

The Year of the Gospel of Mark: Discipleship

We are now going into "Cycle B" of our Church Year with the beginning of Advent on November 30th. This is called "The Year of the Gospel of Mark: Discipleship". The Gospel of Mark is one of four gospels in the Holy Bible. Mark (John Mark was his full name) was an associate with Simon Peter, one of the 12 apostles that followed Jesus Christ throughout His public ministry on earth. Peter was the name given to Simon by Jesus Christ personally (Mark 3:16). Peter was very close to Jesus and after the crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus, Peter was one of the founders of the early Christian church. Although the scrolls were written by Mark, the facts in it are thought to be the accounts of Peter during his ministry with Jesus. The agreement among scholars is that the scrolls of Mark were written between 50 and 60 A.D. Mark's writings are the shortest of all the New Testament gospels and tells of Jesus' ministry in detail of the events and miracles of Jesus and are consistent with the other three gospels; Matthew, Luke and John. The Gospel of Mark gives us many important facts and lessons. First, it clearly proves that Jesus Christ is the Messiah that was foretold throughout the Old Testament, Second, it proves that Jesus was the Son of God, (whom He claimed to be) by living a sinless and perfect life. Third, the Gospel records Jesus' miracles over nature. The most important fact in the Gospel of Mark is the proof that Jesus Christ overcame the power of death through His resurrection from the tomb. Lastly, Jesus gives people perfect instructions for how God wants people to live, handle difficult problems, and make choices regarding their future for eternity. Every word spoken and written in this Gospel can be applied to life and I encouraged you to read the Gospel of Mark and be a good disciple of our Lord.

I invite all of you to help join us in celebrating Christmas this year. Our Christmas Mass begins at 12:00 Noon in DeKalb at Christ the Teacher University Parish and the party begins afterwards at 1:00 PM.

Please join us for prayer and fellowship. Also, thank you to all who have donated gifts for the residents of the Jack Mabley Center. It is always a joy to bring Christmas to the residents there in Dixon, I hope you will consider volunteering to help bring Christ Cheer to a very special community.
