From I-90....Exit to By-pass 20 to Freeport. Take next exit to 20 to Belvidere. First Stoplight on 20 turns right on Mill Road. At stop sign, turn left on W. State Street. Drive over bridge and turn Right where green sign says Cherry Valley Road (walnut). Go one block and turn LEFT onto Cherry Valley Road (says also Genoa Road). Drive many miles and turn RIGHT onto Annie Glidden Road. Drive many miles to N.I.U. campus and Turn LEFT onto Hillcrest. Turn RIGHT at stop sign on Normal Road. Christ the Teacher Parish/Newman Center Church is on your left about 3 blocks down. Park in church parking lot. (Not in University parking lot)

From I-39... Exit to I-38 to DeKalb. Drive many miles till you see the tower that says N.I.U. Huskies, turn LEFT onto Annie Glidden Road. Turn on Lucinda (N.I.U. field House is on the right). Drive to next Stoplight and turn LEFT on Normal Road. Christ the Teacher Parish/Newman Center Church is on your left about 3 blocks down. Park in church parking lot. (Not in University parking lot)

From I-88... Exit to DeKalb (Annie Glidden Road, drive North. Turn Right on Lucinda (N.I.U. field House is on the right). Drive to next Stoplight and turn LEFT on Normal Road. Christ the Teacher Parish/Newman Center Church is on your left about 3 blocks down. Park in church parking lot. (Not in University parking lot)
